Part 3: Monitoring and review

Strategy reporting

The lead agency responsible for implementing actions will regularly report to the implementation committee on their progress. It will be the role of the implementation committee to monitor implementation.

Indicators or targets are a way of measuring progress towards the objectives of the Strategy. In the short-term, existing reporting systems will be used to report on the implementation of the Strategy, rather than duplicating systems already in place. In the longer term, the implementation committee might wish to develop its own reporting framework. To this end, the Department of Sustainability and Environment will explore options for measuring and reporting on the sustainability of settlements.

Strategy reviews

The four key directions of the *Great Ocean Road Region Strategy* are the strategic basis for managing growth and change within the region for the next 20 years. Being a dynamic plan, the Strategy will be reviewed every five years to ensure it remains relevant. It may be necessary to develop new initiatives in response to changes in the local, regional or state environment. The Department of Sustainability and Environment will coordinate reviews of this Strategy. This will be a cooperative process with the other members of the implementation committee.
