Population Mobility Measurement

Mobility within the survey areas was measured by taking the population in June 1961 and dividing this into age groups. These were then aged five years, and deaths allowed for to produce an expected population for 1966. Births were added (less infant deaths) to produce an expected 0-4 age group. The expected population in each group was then compared with the census population of June 1966, and the difference became the measurement of mobility.

Although an age group might show negative net mobility change, this does not necessarily mean that its 1966 population was actually less than in 1961. Provided that the loss due to


mobility was less than the intercensal increase there would still have been some population increase in the given age group despite the negative net mobility change.

For example, in Inner West in 1961 there were 19,963 people in the 15-29 age group whereas by 1966 there were 21,554 people in this age group. However, the number in this age group in 1966 which would have occurred if all persons in the 10-14 group resident in the area had continued to reside there in 1966 would have been 22, 138 people.

As the number actually there in 1966 was 21,554, then a net flow of 584 people out of the area must have occurred.
