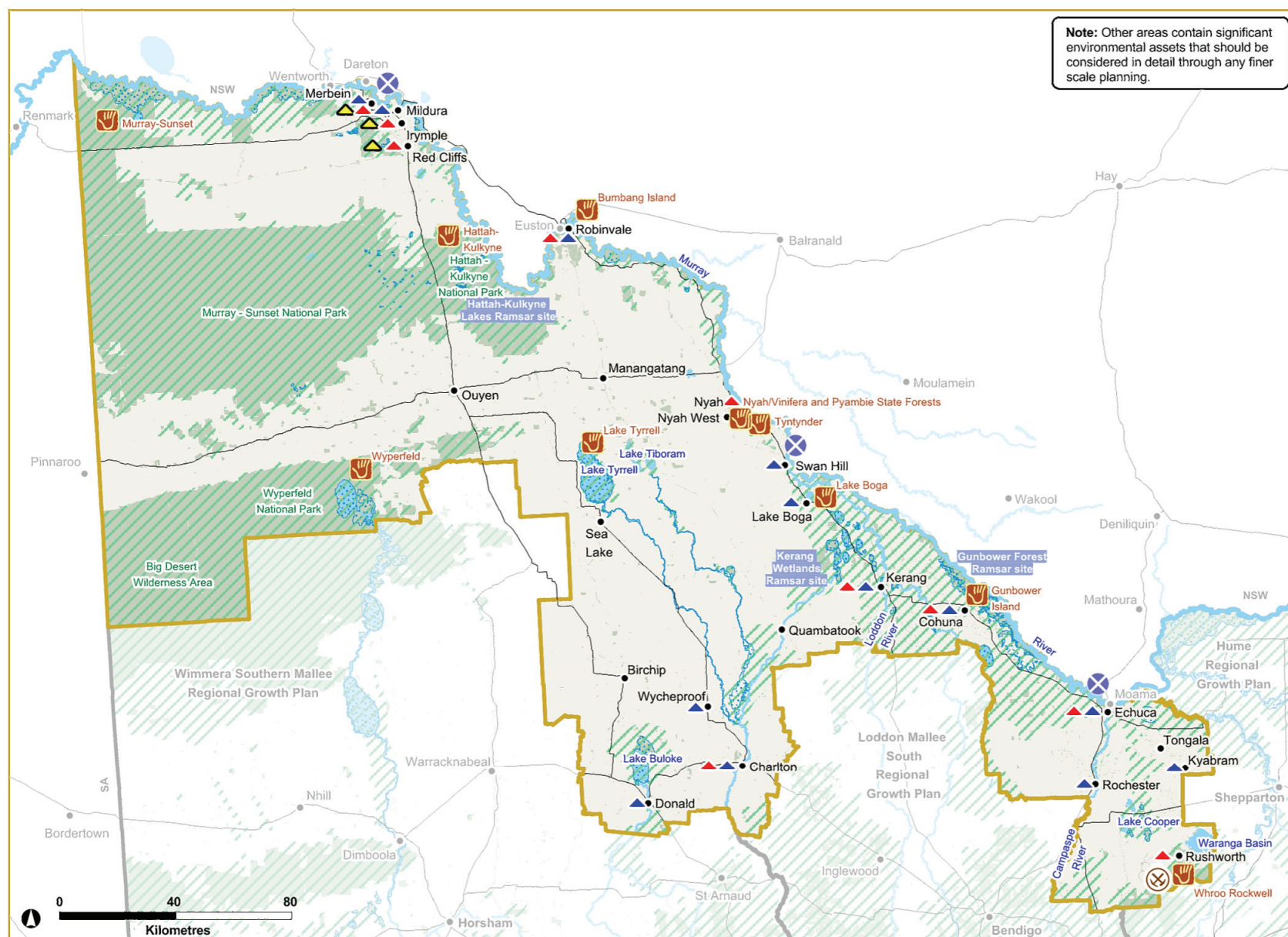




Avoid or minimise the impact of development on high value environmental and cultural heritage assets.
