Soto v Hobsons Bay CC (Red Dot) [2023] VCAT 693 (21 June 2023) Variation of registered restrictive covenant; section 60(2) of the *Planning and Environment Act* 1987 (Vic); consideration of the 'consequence' of the variation.

Colinx Nominees Pty Ltd v Frankston CC (Red Dot) [2023] VCAT 679 (20 June 2023) Whether verandahs and balconies form part of the total floor area of a rooming house under clause 52.23 of planning schemes.
