



Avoid or minimise the impact of development on high value environment and heritage assets and significant landscapes through the use and application of consistent planning tools across the region.

Protect and improve the waterways of the region, in particular the Murray River corridor and significant wetland complexes.

Manage the risks to human life, property and infrastructure by avoiding areas at risk from natural hazards. Where a settlement is not identified as at risk on this map, the risk from natural hazards still needs to be carefully considered in local planning.

Manage growth to help maintain the health of water supply catchments and access to reliable water supplies.
